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National Education Day

Every Year on 11 November, India celebrates National Education Day to commemorate the Birth anniversary of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the First Union Education Minister of India from 1947-1958. Azad was born in Mecca, Saudi Arabia in 1888, but his family relocated to Calcutta in order to provide him a better education. In 1912, Azad started publishing Al-Hilal, a weekly that criticised British Publishing Al-Hilal, a weekly that after it was Banned, he started another weekly Al-Baqah, following which the British Government Banned. Azad is credited with shaping modern education system of India. He strongly advocated the education of women. In 1949, in the central Assembly, he emphasised the importance of imparting instruction in modern Sciences and knowledge. He also said that no programme of national education can be appropriate if it does not give Full consideration to the education and advancement of one-half of the Society - that is the women. He is responsible for Shaping of the country. The first IIT, IISc, School of Planning and Architecture and the University Grants Commission were established under his tenure as the education minister. For his contribution - both as an educationist as a Freedom Fighter. He was awarded the Bharat Ratna in 1992.
